



Sharing God's Bounty June

Therefore My Brothers

Several weeks ago, the Christian Church began the season of Lent by observing Ash Wednesday. Perhaps you knelt at the altar as your forehead was marked with ashes. You heard the words, "You are dust and to dust you shall return." This rite serves to remind us of our beginning: that God created man from the dust of the earth. It also foretells our ending: that our mortal bodies will die and decay. It is a solemn moment; in truth, all of Lent is solemn. Yet, every Christian holds in his heart a secret the world needs to know: "The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ" (1 Corinthians 15:56-57). That is the message of Easter: through Christ we have won the victory! We wept through the night of sorrow, but morning has come and with it the joy of the morning of eternal life (Psalm 30:5b).

We remain on earth, waiting for the fullness of that joy that will be ours when we are in Heaven with the Savior. We are not idle while we wait, however. After his glorious pronouncement of this victory over death, the Apostle Paul continues, "Therefore my beloved brothers, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain" (1 Corinthians 15:58). These are orders for all God's servants, the "beloved brothers." First, "Be steadfast." Day in and day out, not just on Sunday, but every day, all day, we are steadfast, putting the work of the Lord first, keeping uppermost in our minds that all we do is done in his strength and for his glory. At our work and in our homes, we remember that we "are serving the Lord" (Colossians 3:24).

We are "immovable." We don't get sidetracked. In his Gospel, Luke takes his readers along on Jesus' journey to Jerusalem. Like the Israelites traveling through the desert, Jesus' trip was not a straight line and it included many stops (although not for the same reasons), but as faithful as God was to deliver his chosen people, so "immovable" was Jesus on his way. We, too, have a goal: to travel to eternal life doing the Lord's work on our way. We are "immovable" in our desire to practice faithful stewardship on our journey, and God is faithful to go with us on that journey.

By God's grace through which he enables and equips us, we can "always [abound] in the work of the Lord." By God's grace, we overflow with good works. We are eager and willing to give of ourselves and our resources that his work might be done. Even when we get discouraged, we don't quit, because we know "that in the Lord [our] labor is not in vain."

Because God has done this, I respond gladly and freely by doing that. Because God has given himself for me, I respond by giving myself to him in every way that I can. It is not that I owe him anything, or that he needs in a particular way anything that I have. It is simply that I, in sheer gratitude for his many gifts, want to return these gifts, in some small way, by giving of myself.

Sharing God's Bounty July

Finishing Well

The author of Hebrews exhorts us to "throw off everything that hinders and...let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us" (Hebrews 12:1b). The race we run in life more resembles a marathon than a sprint. Our race is a lifelong effort, and we are called to run with perseverance. God wants us to finish well in this marathon of life. In order to finish strong, we need to nurture our faith continually as we spend time in his word and in prayer. Many people will start well but, unfortunately, finish poorly. Solomon started well, King Saul started well, and Lot started well; however, they allowed themselves to be entangled by things of the world, lost their focus, and finished poorly.


Regardless of our physical limitations or any other obstacles we encounter in our races, we need to stay strong in our faith and spirit. We have been called to follow our Lord, and he has not promised us a walk in the park. He has told us that we must be willing to sacrifice security, material things, vocations, and our own will. These things the Apostle Paul considered "rubbish" so that he could be found in Christ (Philippians 3:8). As children of the King, we have a relationship that has been forged by the atoning blood of Christ—and we're "heirs of God and co-heirs with Christ, if indeed we share in his sufferings in order that we may also share in his glory" (Romans 8:17).

The Apostle Paul is a wonderful encouragement and example for us of a person who finished well. As a witness for Christ, he suffered many hardships, but he put his beatings, imprisonments, shipwrecks, and sicknesses into perspective. "For our light and momentary troubles are achieving for us an eternal glory that far outweighs them all" (2 Corinthians 4:17). By God's grace, he overcame his challenges and obstacles to run his race with perseverance to finish well.

In order to finish our races in life well, we need to call upon the Lord in prayer, meditate daily on his word, attend church regularly, partake in the Lord's Supper, and be faithful stewards. May God bless our efforts to run our races well, so we can finish well and spend eternity with Jesus.

The important thing is how much we need to give in order to respond to the things that God has given us. Our thought should be: I need to give - so I will give regardless of my budgets, endowments, or anything else. I cannot fulfill myself as a Christian unless I do give - and I'm willing to let nothing stand in the way of my fulfillment.



- ½ teaspoon vanilla
- 2 cups sliced fruit
- Adult help

What you do:

- Cut the dough into slices ½-inch thick. Place slices on the pan, overlapping them slightly.
- Bake at 375 degrees for 12 minutes. Let cool.
- Combine softened cream cheese, sugar and vanilla, mixing well. Spread this "frosting" over the bakedcookie "crust."
- Arrange fruit on top of the pizza.
- Slice and enjoy!
