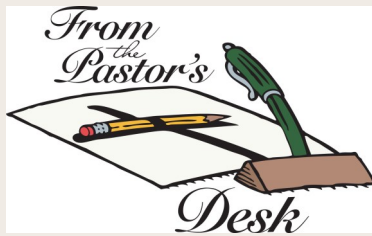

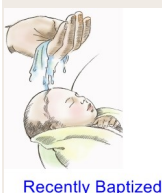

This was discussed at Council and we would like to try something different beginning Sunday November 5th.

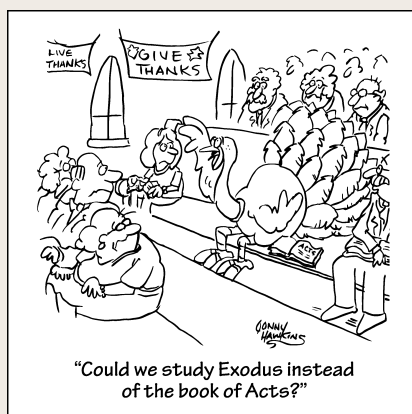

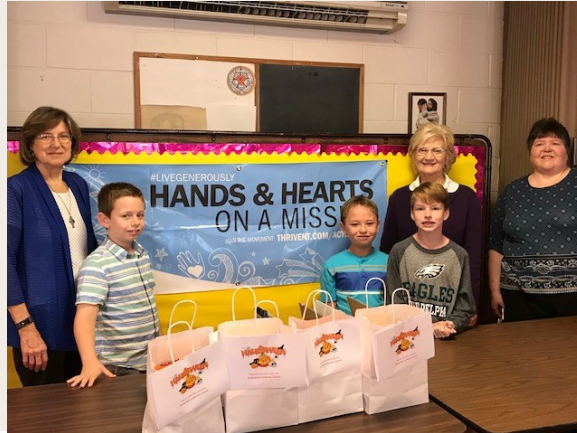

Sharing God's Bounty

November

Part of God's Plan

"In those days . . ." So begins a well-known passage of Scripture. Do you know what comes next? *"In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree . . ."* (Luke 2:1). Some of us can quote the whole story by heart. Even though we've heard it year after year, some of us for many years, the story is still precious to hear, still warms our souls, still excites our minds, still calms our fears.

Two seemingly inconsequential people of little means obeyed that decree and traveled to the town of Bethlehem to register for the census. The woman, Mary, was about to have a child. She knew that her child was the Son of God, a child to be named Jesus. Joseph, her husband, knew he was not the father of the child, although that was how the world saw him. These were two of God's faithful. They knew the prophecies regarding the Messiah. They had been visited by the angel and learned that they were to be part of the fulfillment of those prophecies. They didn't know how things would turn out. They didn't know all that God had in store for them. They just *"obey[ed] their rulers and submitted to their authority"* (Hebrews 13:17) as they trusted God to guide and protect them and his Son each step they took on his path.

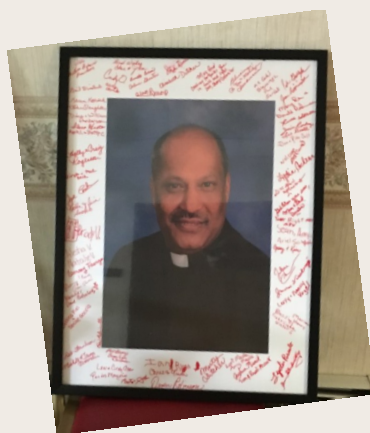
Of course, God did just that. God provided a place for the Child to be born (Luke 2:7). God sent angels to announce the birth of the King and moved the shepherds to respond to the joyful news and go to worship the new Baby (Luke 2:8-20). He sent *"Magi from the East"* who brought *"gifts of gold and of incense and of myrrh"* and then believed the warning God gave them in a dream and avoided the evil King Herod on their return trip (Matthew 2:1-12).

How many of these people involved in this most wondrous story realized the important and memorable parts they played? We cannot say for sure but surmise none could really comprehend the eternal significance of the events as they unfolded.

We, too, are involved in God's plans. Certainly none can equal in importance the birth of Christ, but nothing God does is without purpose. Are we listening for the voice of the Spirit as God speaks to us through God's Word? Are we, as we go about our daily routines, obeying our rulers, cognizant of being God's feet and hands and voice to carry out his plan? Do we bring our gifts, aware that God may use them according to a purpose we can't even imagine? How exciting it is to think and know that we are God's instruments! What a loss of blessing to us if we refuse to let God use us and another gets the opportunity instead (Esther 4:14)!

As we live out our daily lives as stewards, *"let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith . . . so that we will not grow weary and lose heart"* (Hebrews 12:2-3), but instead look forward with eagerness and anticipation toward the unfolding of God's plan in our lives.

Legacy Story— Heeralal Mukesh Cheedie, Pastor



Heeralal Mukesh Cheedie was born on May 21st in Albion Estate which is a village located in Guyana on the country side. In his immediate family, there were eight children, 7 boys and 1 girl.

Pastor Mukesh was raised in a Hindu Family. Very early on he was taught and understood the commitment to Hinduism. As a child when he first woke up he had to go and shower with cold water and then pray to the Sun God. Then he would eat his breakfast and head off to school which lasted from 8am until 3pm with lunch at 12Noon. His surrounding community was very close. There were Hindus, Muslims and Christians all living together and celebrating one another.

His family were farmers by trade working in the rice fields and coconut plantations and raising cows. Rice was a source of income and a frequent food on the dinner plate. As Hindus they do not eat beef or pork but will raise the animals and sell them for income.

Pastor Mukesh described his earlier years as living as somewhat of a nomad. While he lived in the village, he would walk 2-3 miles away to tend to the fields. It was not uncommon to spend several weeks in the bush. This was common practice to be away from your family for some time as your labored in the fields.

While attending school, he was playing cricket and decided for his future career that he wanted to be a cricketer. He had the opportunity to represent his school at the county level (one level below the country level) but things didn't go as planned and he felt that he was robbed from a spot on the team due to politics and money. These feelings led him to start drinking as a way of coping with the disappointment.

He did however, complete school and was invited to join another cricket team that went touring to Suriname, a neighboring country for 3 months. He returned home on Christmas Eve. Now in his village there was a Lutheran Church which was celebrating Christmas Eve with a program and everyone was planning to attend and gather there. He went and recalls standing in the window and looking out when he noticed a beautiful “young girl”. They made eye contact but never spoke. It was love at first sight as the woman was Cameel, his future wife. This Lutheran Church hosted a Luther League which he began attending so that he could keep seeing Cameel, who was a granddaughter of a Lutheran bishop in Guyana. For 8 years he attended and never spoke with her. In his off hours he continued to drink. At some point, he and Cameel connected and were certain that they wanted to marry and he decided to convert to Christianity. This decision was not initially supported by his parents, however, it was the lesser of the two evils and he stopped drinking. In 1987 with the help of his parents who sponsored them, Pastor Mukesh and Cameel moved to the United States and settled into Corona, Queens, New York. They began to visit different churches where they sang and played guitar and started various music ministries. Sometime later they moved to Brooklyn, New York with the intention of starting a family and began attending St. Paul Lutheran Church located at 592 Knickerbocker Avenue. It was at this church that the Pastor identified his gift of music and they started a Contemporary Service. The congregation was multi-cultural including Guyanese, African Americans and people of Spanish background. The Pastor also encouraged Mukesh to become a Deacon and he got involved with the Stephen Ministry.

Pastor Mukesh had several friends that he played volleyball with that lived in Levittown, PA and they encouraged him to move here and be closer. In 1996 the entire family which now included his daughters Rossanna and Marisa moved into the house where they still reside. The family began attending Christ Lutheran Church in the Lakeside section of Levittown. He started a Praise band again. He was visited by the Pastor of that church who recognized his gifts and encouraged him to go to Seminary which he did in 2001 and then graduated in 2005. After graduation, it was not an easy road. He was unemployed, using food stamps and working odd jobs with a friend for some income. He remained faithful with his journey and in June 2006 he received his first

call at St. Paul Lutheran Church in Tannersville, PA as an Associate Pastor. His family had a difficult time adjusting to life in Tannersville. They had not yet sold their house in Levittown, so they remained in the house and he rented a place in Tannersville. This lasted until 2008 when he received his second call at Emmanuel Lutheran Church in Souderton. He had previously done an internship at this church.

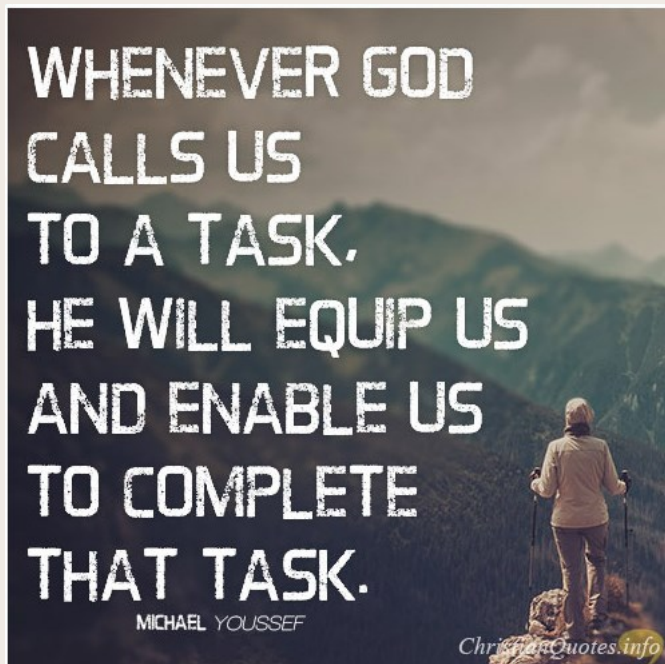
While Pastor Mukesh enjoyed his service in Souderton, after many years it became a challenge. He was beginning to feel burned out. So much time was spent travelling back and forth. He recalled missing many school functions of his daughters. Ministry was changing in the church and the congregation was resistant to moving forward and was no longer sharing the same vision as Pastor Mukesh. He contacted our Bishop and asked for a change. This was all happening during the time we at Redeemer were going through our call process. We received his paperwork, interviewed him and the rest is as they say history. He started at Redeemer on March 1st which was Ash Wednesday and his official ordination ceremony was Sunday, April 30th.

If you've ever spent any time with Pastor Mukesh you would know that his ministry philosophy is to "Enable and Equip". He believes in identifying the gifts that are within us and helping us to develop and use those gifts as we improve our relationship with God. He is not out to change things but to further enhance and development programs.

He would love to develop and share more ministry opportunities with the congregation and the community. He believes it is important that we help others see the bigger purpose of the church. We need to engage the younger folks. It is important to remember that church can come in different formats. Church is not just a building that we visit on Sunday mornings. When a connection is made then a commitment is felt and we can all serve as disciples for God. We just need to listen and learn to ask the right questions.

Redeemer is glad to have Pastor Mukesh here with us and we look forward to many years together ensuring our church's legacy.
