

### BOSCOV UPDATE:



#### **Discipleship through Stewardship by Brian Schmidt**

As some of you may know, I am a manager in the Subcontract Program Management function at Lockheed Martin in Moorestown, NJ. I have been with Lockheed for 15 years, and as of 2018, I have been promoted to the “manager” of our team.

Personally, I do not like the word “manager”. I believe we are all “leaders”, in different ways. I am a leader of 16 individuals on my team. My job is not to manage their day-to-day work, but to lead them through the challenges they encounter throughout the ups and downs on the programs they support. As the leader of the team, I have been through many of the situations that my team members are going through. My experiences can help guide my team members through issues as they arise.

However, this year, there have been situations that have arisen outside of our day-to-day responsibilities that I have struggled with. Racial Injustice, police brutality, political separation, COVID, and more recently, the attacks on our Asian American population. All of these backgrounds are present on my team on one way or another. I have African American team members, members of my team who have family members who are part of local police departments (including my brother and sister-in-law and best friend who are Philadelphia cops), many different political views, a largely female team, along with a couple of Asian Americans on my team.

Diversity has become the norm, which I welcome because it brings different perspectives that we can all learn from. However, I have struggled trying to figure out how to be an example of Discipleship through Stewardship. Stewardship really is the day-to-day job of a leader. But how do I handle these topics and situations that have arisen? One of pastor’s sermon touched on this. As disciples, we are asked to bring people together. My team members needed to know that they were not isolated in their thoughts and feelings. People need to know they have a safe place to discuss their concerns and open up. Over the last year, I have setup multiple discussions with my team focusing on African American prejudice, police brutality and I have a discussion planned at the end of March for the attacks on Asian

Americans in our society. All discussions have been extremely positive and have given members of my team a safe forum to discuss their concerns. One of the concerns I discussed was the overwhelming negative view on our police. I expressed that I understand that every “group” has a “bad apple”, but let’s also remember that the majority and taking major steps to keep us safe. That triggered multiple other teammates to communicate their thoughts on the same subject, thinking they were wrong in their defense of police.

What I learned is it is not always about what you say or what you do, but what opportunities you can provide to others. Maybe it’s a shoulder to lean on, an ear to listen, or a forum to express your concerns and feelings. I have heard great feedback from my team because it gave them an outlet to discuss their feelings. In doing this, I really did feel like I was doing God’s work. And you know what, sometimes it not as hard as you think. Sometimes people just need someone to ask them how they are doing and listen to them. Reach out to someone. Ask how they are doing. Lend an ear. They will appreciate it!

To know that Jesus rose again!




### The Jelly Bean Prayer

## **Food Pantry Ministry**

Things have slowed down a bit at the food pantry. Hopefully that means people are getting back on their feet and are in a better place in their lives. While we love to help people, it is also a good thing if people don't need us anymore!

New at the pantry are two different things we are receiving. Our neighbor who works for the Neshaminy School District, told one of her co-workers about our pantry. The woman works in the lunchroom at Herbert Hoover Elementary School and was not happy about throwing away food. She has been coming to the pantry 2-3 times a week and bringing items that the kids didn't want to eat or buy. We have been receiving cups of tomatoes, beans, little bags of carrots, applesauce and peach cups, little containers of regular milk, chocolate milk and apple juice. It is a welcome addition to everything else we have.

The other thing we have been getting is from Jen O'Connell. She works in the cafeteria at George School. She has been dropping off food from the cafeteria about 2 times a week. We get all kinds of different foods from her. She's brought chicken alfredo meals, ziti, chickpeas and rice, pork and vegetable carnitas, grilled cheese sandwiches, ruben sandwiches, egg, cheese and bacon sandwiches, to name a few. Every time she comes, she brings something different! We are so happy we can offer our visitors different items like that.

Now as you peruse the library, you can take a look at the old pictures and reminisce. Lynn Leppo's son took it for his wife who owns a bridal shop. She is going to clean it up and use it to display bridal items. We are very happy it was able to go to a good home instead of just throwing it away. Thanks to Edna Schwenk and Arlene Shecter for all of their hard work with organizing those items as well as the library.

RAMM continues to provide meals to members who are experiencing stressful situations such as family illness, etc. throughout the month. A very special thank you to: Carole Chatelain who prepared homemade chicken noodle soup and chicken broth to our menu of provisions. And thank you also, Karen Kondryk and Dolores Danielson volunteered to provide a full meal when needed.

**NEW INITIATIVE:** Social Ministry is gearing up to provide disposable baby diapers in sizes 2, 3 and 4 to the mothers residing at the Pennel and Morrisville Emergency Shelters. The purchase of diapers is not permissible with government provided funds. Because diapers are so very expensive, mothers often must delay changing their babies to save money for other necessities. Mothers have even resorted to using rags and plastic bags to keep their babies clean and comfortable. Cloth diapers are not an option for most because Laundromats and some communal facilities do not permit the laundering of diapers in their machines. If you would like to assist in this new initiative, please mark your contribution to Social Ministry – Diapers. We also ask that you look for coupons that we can use to reduce the cost of our expenditures.

# Sharing God's Bounty

## April

### What's Your Gift?

Perhaps you haven't spent much time, if any, pondering that question. God has given each of us at least one gift, though, and if even one of us does not use that gift, the Body of Christ suffers. Paul, in Ephesians 4:16 writes, *"From him the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, grows and build itself up in love, as each part does its work."*

Christian stewards tend to have a lower opinion of themselves than they ought, denigrating their abilities and talents and even their financial capabilities. When we keep in mind that it is God himself who has chosen our gifts and blessed us materially, we realize that to belittle these gifts is to question God's wisdom and generosity. Again we read Paul's words, now from Romans 12:5, *". . . in Christ, we who are many form one body, and each member belongs to all the others."* He goes on to say that whatever our gifts are, we are to use them as effectively as we can.

Yes, it is the pastor's job to preach the Word and administer the Sacraments, but we, as stewards who have received the Great Commission from Matthew 28:19-20, are to be obedient also to Jesus' command to tell the Good News to the whole world.

Yes, there are those in your congregation who seem to have more abilities and talents than you, and there may be members who have more money than you – perhaps may even be very wealthy. Does that exempt you from the responsibility to serve or to give? By no means! In 2 Corinthians 9:7 we're commanded, *"Each man should give what he has decided in his heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver."* Each one is to give and to give cheerfully – of his time, his talents, and his treasures. God looks at the size of the heart of the giver rather than at the size of his gift. *"For if the willingness is there, the gift is acceptable according to what one has, not according to what he does not have"* (2 Corinthians 8:12).

If you are not using your gifts, if you are not giving your money, if you are not sharing your time, the Body of Christ suffers. We need each other and our individual gifts in order that we might carry out our responsibilities as stewards to the end that the name of Christ might be made known.

*Stewardship is not about large giving, but gifts in small ways. A child's gift, although small, gives glory to the Lord in many ways. Stewardship does not have to be in monetary ways. A gift of time to an elderly shut-in serves the Lord, too, A gift of a loaf of bread to a homeless family could mean the difference between going to bed hungry or going to bed satisfied.*


# PUZZLE
