

## Pastor's Page

Grace and Peace to you from God the Father and from our Lord and Savior Jesus, the Christ.

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, as I was thinking what I should share with you in this month's newsletter, I came across this story on a Facebook post. After reading it, I find it very uplifting and encouraging, reminding me that to quote the writer of this story, "When we avoid walking through life's challenges, we miss out on all God has for us."

I pray you too will find it uplifting and encouraging as you walk through life's challenges.

My five-year-old daughter and I were just about ready to leave Target today when it started to pour rain. We stopped our cart behind the automatic glass doors and looked out at the windy wet parking lot. In front of us other finished shoppers were waiting, either for a designated family member to pick them up at the sidewalk or for the weather to lessen.

"Do we wait or just get wet," I asked my little one. "Let's just get wet," she said. We waited five minutes - because our car wasn't parked close - but the rain only got worse. So, we decided to make a run for it. On our way out, I asked my daughter if she was sure. "It's going to be cold," I said. "Let's go," she exclaimed.

We hurried across the lot, buckets of water dumping on us. I got her into the car, unloaded our bags and hopped in the front seat. I turned the heater on, thinking my daughter would complain she was cold.

"Mom," she said. "Are you okay," I asked, turning around to see her smiling big. "We did this," she said. "You did this. We got wet. Now, we can go home." As I turned the heater on and drove home in the storm, I thought about all the people still at Target waiting on it to pass. How often do we let life's storms keep us from getting where God has called us to go? We think, if we just wait, whatever obstacle we are facing might go away. We freeze on the other side of the door. We make the comfortable choice.

But our avoidance is more impactful than just being stuck in a store on a Saturday afternoon. When we avoid walking through life's challenges, we miss out on all God has for us.

When we hesitate to step out on faith, we wind up perpetually standing still.

My daughter wasn't hesitant to go out into the rain today. She embraced the inconvenience as part of the day's journey. She was willing to take on a challenge to get where she wanted to go.

Sometimes in life, you have to get wet.

### Shared Meal News & Redeem a Meal Ministry (RAMM)

Redeemer Shared Meal has been notified that the *Advocates for the Homeless and Those in Need* has made the decision to hold off any In-door, in-person get together meals until at least January 2022. Redeemer will continue to provide thirty-five (35) meals in take-out containers which will be picked up by a volunteer from the *Advocates* on the first Tuesday of each month.

The Social Ministry Committee will continue coordinating delivery of home cooked meals to those who are experiencing additional stress such as illness, hospitalization, demanding medical treatments, death of a close one, or loneliness for being socially isolated. Additionally, the Social Ministry and the Shared Meal Ministry are teaming up to offer delivery or pickup of a Shared Meal every month. If you, or someone you know, would appreciate being “redeemed;” from the chore of meal preparation, and want delivery please contact Patti Finn (267-987-3257). Let her know how many meals you need to be delivered.



Since I was a little girl attending church with my family one of the only stewardship memories I have is when my parents talked about how much their financial offering to the church would be. We were a family of 8, 6 children and my parents, and though we never went without my parents ran on a tight budget. What was seldom referred to as stewardship was the use of their time and talents which was abundantly clear in the Lutheran church I grew up in.

As an adult, I now see that Discipleship through Stewardship is much more than the amount of money you give, though this is an important part of good stewardship since it takes money to do ministry. Being a faithful disciple through stewardship is doing the work of our Lord. I have learned that sharing the love of Jesus is expressed in all we do at home, at school, at work, in the community and of course church. And it doesn’t matter if you are 5 or 95, everyone is a disciple of stewardship.

As I look back, my life as a steward focused mostly on the music talent I was blessed with. As a first grader I was leading the upper grades in choir selections, as well as reading from a sixth-grade reading book. I loved to sing and used my talent all through school as well as in the church choir. In addition I volunteered where my mother worked at Eastern State school and hospital and sang at the religious services. Many times we would sing duets which the residents loved.

When I became a mother, I used to call myself a professional volunteer trying to juggle volunteer opportunities for 3 kids at the same time in addition to sharing the gifts God blessed me with at church. At one point it felt like a full-time job but being a disciple through stewardship is a full-time job! Its living out the life you have been blessed with. I see that now and I know that I used and still use the gifts God has blessed me with to fulfill God’s mission with music and caring for others.

This is one special part of my discipleship through stewardship, and I pray I can continue to live as a faithful steward.

# Sharing God's Bounty

## September 2021

### Sharing God's Love

As God's people, we are empowered by the Holy Spirit to follow Jesus' command to "Love [our] neighbor as [ourselves]" (Matthew 22:39). We can share God's love because he has first loved us (1 John 4:19). God is the source of love that we give to others. When we love others, God's love is made complete (1 John 4:17). Love is the distinguishing mark of God's followers.

It is both a privilege and a responsibility to share the love that God has given to us with others. In Romans 12:13 Paul wrote, "Share with God's people who are in need. Practice hospitality." To the Galatians Paul wrote, "Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers" (Galatians 6:10).

The following two contrasting stories in Scripture help us see how love can make such a huge difference in our relationship with and our attitude toward people:

In the story of Cain and Abel, we see Cain's total disregard for his brother Abel. After Cain had killed Abel, the Lord said to Cain, "Where is your brother Abel?" Cain said, "Am I my brother's keeper" (Genesis 4:9). Cain was a man without faith and love. God's love did not dwell in Cain, and it showed in his actions. Cain also showed his lack of love for God by giving an inferior gift.

In the Parable of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10:25-37), God's Word gives us an example of how we are to share our love with others. Traveling on the road to Jericho, the Good Samaritan found a man who had been beaten and robbed. The Good Samaritan stopped and attended to the injured person. After he had bandaged his wounds, he took him to an inn where he paid for his room and care. The Samaritan sacrificed money, time, and possessions and risked his own health and safety for this wounded stranger. By putting no limits on how far he was willing to go to help this man, the Samaritan demonstrated the love we should have for others.

As God's people filled with his love, we will be compelled to do acts of love for others. "For Christ's love compels us, because we are convinced that one died for all, and therefore all died. And he died for all, that those who live should no longer live for themselves but for him who died for them and was raised again" (2 Corinthians 5:14-15). Motivated by Christ's love and empowered by his Spirit, we will be eager to share God's love with others as we perform acts of service.

*God has given us many gifts and calls us to use those gifts to build up his kingdom. Our faith identifies us as stewards and gives us a relationship with God. Many of these gifts are given for our needs; others are given for the needs of others. Stewardship is a ministry by which we nurture and share our gifts.*


