
If anyone ever attended Sunday school or Bible study, you are familiar with the parable of the Talents. (Mathew 25:14-30) In this teaching, Jesus tells of a master who was going on a long journey and entrusted his property to his servants. Two of his servants went out and doubled their investments but the third did nothing with what was given to him. Those who used their talents were rewarded according to their ability but the servant who did nothing was let go.

So. what is the message Jesus was sending? Not being a theological scholar, I can only share the message I grew up with. We have each been given special talents/gifts from God. God wants us to use whatever talents we possess in his service. It doesn't matter if we are the "best" but that we use our talents to the best of our ability. If you can use a broom help someone who needs assistance cleaning their residence. You can paint, use a hammer or a saw? Give a hand to someone who needs work done. Or maybe you can sing or play an instrument, volunteer in your church choir, or offer music at worship. Cooking might be your gift, plan a meal for someone who could use help. JUNE-Discipleship through Dialogue

Read the following Bible verse, lesson, and prayer. You might want to discuss the ending questions with a family member or fellow churchgoer.

Acts 2:42-47 - And they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. And awe came upon every soul, and many wonders and signs were being done through the apostles. And all who believed were together and had all things in common. And they were selling their possessions and belongings and distributing the proceeds to all, as any had need. And day by day, attending the temple together and breaking bread in their homes, they received their food with glad and generous hearts, praising God and having favor with all the people. And the Lord added to their number day by day those who were being saved.

The early church was generous—too generous, some people today would say. They were selling property and sharing with the poor like there was no tomorrow. And they were happy! As Luke says, they had "glad and generous hearts, praising God and having favor with all the people." What could cause this sort of generous joy?

There's one time it's incredibly easy to be generous, and that's when you yourself have just received the gift of a lifetime. Who can be stingy when your heart is overflowing with joy and gratitude? That was the case with these Christians, and it's the case for us today, too. Why? Because God Himself has poured out all His riches upon us, and we are so blessed we hardly know where to turn.

Think about it. What has God given us? Life—joy—forgiveness of sins. The promise of a new heaven and earth with no evil or sin to trouble us. Jesus, God's own Son, to be our Savior. The Holy Spirit, to live within us and keep us forever.

And since Jesus is God made visible for us—what has Jesus done for us in particular? Become a human being, leaving the glory of heaven to share our difficult lives on earth. Healed and taught and preached and forgave, with all patience and kindness. Proved to us through His actions that every human being matters to God, however poor or oppressed or young or old. Laid down His life for us on the cross, so that we might be forgiven and set free from the power of evil. Rose from the dead, so that everyone who trusts in Him will share that same everlasting life and joy. Promised to return to take us to be with Him forever—so that we need not fear the future. We know the One who rules life and death, and He holds us in His own scarred hands.

These are just a few of the overflowing gifts of God He has heaped on us. Faced with His love, we respond with gladness—and God's generous love overflows through us to others.

WE PRAY: Father, open my heart to share Your blessings with others—and show me the specific ways You want me to do that. Amen.

"Let us not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing..." Hebrews 10:25

Thankfully our Lord never takes a vacation from blessing us with his abundant love, gracious gifts, and providential care. 


Kid's Page



Answer B (See Mark 4:33-34.)







Some popcorn plus a little heat makes a big change.

What you need:

- 2 Tbsp. popcorn kernels
- · 2 tsp. oil
- 1 Tbsp. sugar
- Brown paper lunch bag

What you do:

- Add popcorn kernels, oil and sugar to the bag.
- Fold the bag's top down about half an inch. Repeat two more times. Gently shake to mix ingredients.
- Microwave for 1½ or 2 minutes (or use the Popcorn setting). Allow bag to cool before removing and opening it.
- 4. As you share popcorn with family and friends, discuss the change in the kernels. Read Acts 2 together. What changes did the disciples experience? What was the source of their power?
