### Pastor's Page

Grace and Peace to you from God the Father and from our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, Amen.

Have you ever wondered why we do what we do in our liturgy when we gather to worship?

According to Professor Craig L. Nessan, "everything we do at worship is directly related to forming us for a way of life as Christian people in the world. As we participate in liturgy, we not only are worshipping God but also engaging in rituals that immerse us in



the person and way of Jesus Christ himself, who makes us members of the body of Christ and engraves upon us Christ's very own character."

As God in Christ by the power of the Holy Spirit is the Primary Actor when we gather for worship, Professor Nessan says, "Worship is less about what we are doing for God and far more about what God in Christ is seeking to do to us. As we immerse ourselves in each of the worship practices in the liturgy, we are formed distinctively for Christian life practices in the world."

In the next several months, for my newsletter article, I will share Professor Nessan's explanation of each element of the worship service, and how these worship practices are formation for life practices. For this month, I will begin with the **Invocation** and **Confession** and **Forgiveness.** 

#### Invocation:



"In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." The naming of the Trinity at the start of the liturgy reminds us that everything we do in the worship service involves the activity of this Triune God, who promises to be present among us, meet us, and transform us according

to the things we do at worship. Both the naming of the Holy Trinity and the practice of making the sign of the cross link us inextricably to our baptismal identity in Christ, the source of our Christian vocation for service to neighbors in our ministries in daily life.

# Pastor's Page continued

#### **Confession and Forgiveness:**

Certainly, confession of sin and receiving forgiveness involves admitting our fault and responsibility for sinning, even as we receive God's actual forgiveness and pardon from God for Christ's sake. This worship practice, however, also instructs us in a life practice. We learn that admitting our mistakes, asking for forgiveness, and practicing reconciliation is a way of life for Christian people every day.




We confess our sins and receive forgiveness from God in Christ at worship, and thereby we learn to practice confession, forgiveness, and reconciliation in our relationships with other people in our daily lives. We confess our sin and receive forgiveness, "so that we may delight in your will and walk in your ways, to the glory of your holy name" and "live and serve you in newness of life."

In the month of December, we will be looking at the **Thanksgiving for Baptism** and the **Gathering song**.

STEWARDSHIP TEAM – Stewardship Team is working on a new Stewardship program. More information to follow.





Through your participation, we were able to raise \$80 for our current fund.






## **Girl Scouts say Thank You**

The Fun Friday Cabaret is being postponed until the spring





# **Discipleship through Dialogue**

Read the following Bible verse, lesson, and prayer. You might want to discuss the ending questions with a family member or fellow

Matthew 14:13a, 14-21 - Now when Jesus ... went ashore He saw a great crowd, and He had compassion on them and healed their sick. Now when it was evening, the disciples came to Him and said, "This is a desolate place, and the day is now over; send the crowds away to go into the villages and buy food for themselves."



But Jesus said, "They need not go away; you give them something to eat." They said to Him, "We have only five loaves here and two fish." And he said, "Bring them here to Me." Then He ordered the crowds to sit down on the grass, and taking the five loaves and the two fish, He looked up to heaven and said a blessing.

Then He broke the loaves and gave them to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the crowds. And they all ate and were satisfied. And they took up twelve baskets full of the broken pieces left over. And those who ate were about five thousand men, besides women and children

I wonder what the disciples' faces looked like when Jesus said that to them—"You give them something to eat." They knew they didn't have what it took to do the job. Why was Jesus asking, then? And yet, God does the same thing today, doesn't He? One phone call or letter, and your life is changed forever. "You want me to raise that child, Lord? I haven't got the first idea what to do." "You're going to dump that project in my lap, God? You know I don't have those skills." Or my own favorite from young adulthood: "You're calling me to be a what?"

# Discipleship through Dialogue continued

Jesus has a habit of calling the unqualified to do the impossible. (I've always suspected it has something to do with His sense of humor.) And it makes for some terrifying moments. But in the end, it comes out all right—for the disciples and for us. Because Jesus supplies what we lack—whether it's wisdom, money, courage, or miracle-working power.

The disciples told Him honestly what they had, and Jesus worked with that. His instructions were plain and simple, and in the end, everyone was fed. When God faces us with the impossible, we can do what the disciples did—tell Him honestly, "This is all I can bring to the situation," and then wait. Because in the end, it isn't us in charge. It's Jesus.

This is the God who planned to save the entire world, including us, from the power of sin, death, and the devil—and how? Using only a single human life—His own. He lay down that life for all of us on a cross outside Jerusalem, paying the price for all our evil. And three days later, He rose from the dead, breaking the power of death not just for Himself but for all of us who trust in Him. That's a lot to do with so little!

And He can do extraordinary things with us limited people as well, if we will trust Him.

**WE PRAY**: Dear Lord, help me to trust You when You call on me to do something for You. Amen.

# Sharing God's Bounty November

#### Part of God's Plan

"In those days . . ." So begins a well-known passage of Scripture. Do you know what comes next? "In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree . . ." (Luke 2:1). Some of us can quote the whole story by heart. Even though we've heard it year after year, some of us for many years, the story is still precious to hear, still warms our souls, still excites our minds, still calms our fears.

Two seemingly inconsequential people of little means obeyed that decree and traveled to the town of Bethlehem to register for the census. The woman, Mary, was about to have a child. She knew that her child was the Son of God, a child to be named Jesus. Joseph, her husband, knew he was not the father of the child, although that was how the world saw him. These were two of God's faithful. They knew the prophecies regarding the Messiah. They had been visited by the angel and learned that they were to be part of the fulfillment of those prophecies. They didn't know how things would turn out. They didn't know all that God had in store for them. They just "obey[ed their] rulers and submitted to their authority" (Hebrews 13:17) as they trusted God to guide and protect them and his Son each step they took on his path.

Of course, God did just that. God provided a place for the Child to be born (Luke 2:7). God sent angels to announce the birth of the King and moved the shepherds to respond to the joyful news and go to worship the new Baby (Luke 2:8-20). He sent "Magi from the East" who brought "gifts of gold and of incense and of myrrh" and then believed the warning God gave them in a dream and avoided the evil King Herod on their return trip (Matthew 2:1-12).

How many of these people involved in this most wondrous story realized the important and memorable parts they played? We cannot say for sure but surmise none could really comprehend the eternal significance of the events as they unfolded.

We, too, are involved in God's plans. Certainly none can equal in importance the birth of Christ, but nothing God does is without purpose. Are we listening for the voice of the Spirit as God speaks to us through God's Word? Are we, as we go about our daily routines, obeying our rulers, cognizant of being God's feet and hands and voice to carry out his plan? Do we bring our gifts, aware that God may use them according to a purpose we can't even imagine? How exciting it is to think and know that we are God's instruments! What a loss of blessing to us if we refuse to let God use us and another gets the opportunity instead (Esther 4:14)!

As we live out our daily lives as stewards, "let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith . . . so that we will not grow weary and lose heart" (Hebrews 12:2-3), but instead look forward with eagerness and anticipation toward the unfolding of God's plan in our lives.




