


Continuing with the Worship practices that form us, this month's reflection focus on the Creed.



Creed: "I/We believe..." The words of the Apostles' or Nicene Creed are confessed at worship in communion with Christians who have lived and died for these convictions in past generations and in solidarity with all Christians throughout the world today. The creeds serve as our pledge of allegiance. These are the things for which I stand as a Christian. These are the beliefs according to which I intend to live and, if necessary, these are convictions for which I would be willing to die, as did the martyrs of old and as do Christians yet today under difficult circumstances. Confessing the Creed grounds us in the core convictions for which we stand and challenges us to live according to these commitments every day of our lives. We are called to be a member of the one holy catholic and apostolic church, practice the forgiveness of sins, and trust in the resurrection of the body and life everlasting through all the challenging circumstances of our daily lives. The threefold form of these Creeds deeply connects us to our shared faith in the Triune God. Of particular importance: each time we confess the Apostles' Creed we are reconnected directly to the confession of faith made at the time of our own baptism, our shared point of departure for living out our baptismal vocation in service to others in all ministry in daily life.

And this is his command: to believe in the name of his Son, Jesus Christ, and to love one another as he commanded us. (1 John 3:23)

# Council Highlights April 2024

#### COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS FROM COUNCIL MEETING ON 3-12-24

WORSHIP TEAM – Lent began on Ash Wednesday and Liz Sarvat distributed ashes with Pastor to the folks at the Penndel train station. What a great outreach to the community! We had worship services in the parish hall on March 10<sup>th</sup> which was a very nice service. On Palm Sunday the Passion Story will be read. Holy Week – Maundy Thursday and Good Friday will be our usual worship services at 7 PM. The Easter Vigil will be held on Saturday night at 7 PM. We had a good turnout last year and hoping our attendance will increase this year. On Easter Sunday we will be having two worship services, 9 am and 11 am. As far as Technology in the worship service, we continue to have some glitches with our WI-FI service, but overall everything is going well. We will continue to work on this.

FAITH FORMATION – Jess reports that weekly attendance continues to be hit or miss. No younger children have been showing up, mostly preteens. They are focusing on bible skills and general bible knowledge. On Palm Sunday, the children will have an egg hunt after the worship service/Sunday school. As an outreach in the community, we will be handing out information at the borough egg hunt on Saturday, March 30<sup>th</sup>.





Desolation Mountain



Observe these rules:

Items should be shelf stable.

Items must have an ingredients label, else they can be thrown away.

Items must have a date stamped on them no cryptic codes, a sell by/best by/ expiration date, else they are thrown away.



The packaging must be intact, else it's thrown away.

Cans must not have dents along the rim seal, nor dents that form a crease or point - tiny cracks can form and there's a risk of contamination, else it's thrown away.

If you know the product has been recalled, don't donate it - the pantry staff are aware of the recall and all you're doing is forcing them to throw it away for you.

Please don't donate disgusting things: like kettle-corn flavored coffee, sushi-flavored tooth-paste, etc. - nobody is that desperate.

People tend to feel better about things they recognize - donate dehydrated mushrooms in a package with all Japanese writing on it, and there's a good chance nobody will pick it up.

Please donate food packaged in quantities you'd find in a common supermarket. Periodically, people will donate something like a 5-pound can of tuna or 7-pound jar of peanut butter they found at Costco. Not only is it difficult to shelve, but you just can't reasonably expect your average person (or family) to be able to find a place for it or eat it before it goes bad.

#### **Stewardship Ministry**

A word on Christian Stewardship by Denise Robinson

The ELCA stewardship page is a wonderful resource for those who want to learn more about stewardship. "Growing stewardship



step by step" is one of these resources. Each month for the next few months, we will share devotions from this publication to help you on your discipleship through stewardship spiritual journey.

#### Growing Stewards Step by Step Twelve Devotions and Prayers Devotions 1 and 2

Stewardship is a spiritual issue not a financial issue. The journey to being a good steward has many steps. For some people this starts with reading, reflection, and prayer. Here are twelve devotions for this purpose. The inspiration for these writings is taken from "Stepping Stones of a Steward" by Ron Vallet (Eerdsmans Publishing; Grand Rapids, MI; © 1989)

### Devotion 1 Realizing How Much God Loves You

Luke 15:11-32

How do you see God's love in your daily life? Jesus' parable of the prodigal is an example of the deep and profound love between a father and his son (and, God with God's people). This parable could also be named the parable of the prodigal father. It is the father who is a central character. The selfish and jealous behavior of the two sons is a sharp contrast to the loving behavior of the father. Similarly, God's most basic character is love.

What experiences in life are brought to memory by this parable? Has there been a time in your life when you wanted to go off to a far country? It was not unusual for younger Jewish sons to venture into the Dispersion. Centuries later in colonial England, it was not unusual for younger sons to venture to the colonies to start their life. And in our own country, it was not unusual for younger sons to respond to the challenge, "Go west, young man."

These ventures were often undertaken because there was sense of love and security at home, and a loving relationship with God. The life of Jesus was a venture to live in a "new creation", a "new age". It was difficult for the disciples to leave their settings and follow Jesus. It was even more difficult to grasp the significance of Jesus' teachings. Yet as their experiences evolved there were revelations that showed God's love and presence in every day life.

#### **Stewardship Ministry (continued)**

The older son struggled to see the loving relationship with his father and brother upon the brother's return. Yet the father's love was free, unmerited and unconditional to both sons. It is this kind of love that God has for God's people. The breadth of this love is expressed in words penciled on the wall of a narrow room in an asylum-

Could we with ink the ocean fill,
And were the skies of parchment made,
Were every stalk on earth a quill,
And ev'ry man a scribe by trade:
To write the love of God above
Would drain the ocean dry;
Nor could the scroll contain the whole,
Tho' stretched from sky to sky.

In reflecting on the breadth of God's love, what steps might you take in your life to enhance your realization of God's love?

Let us pray: Lord God, you are a loving Creator and Provider. Help us to see your presence in our daily life, in the gift of life, in the gift of your Son Jesus Christ and in the Body of Christ. Give us the vision to look beyond our personal desires and needs. Give us the sensitivity to hear your word above our daily activity. Open our eyes too, to the times when we are like the older son, looking for the best robe and the fatted calf, only wanting for ourselves. May the Holy Spirit give us guidance to see your loving presence and will in our life. Amen.

## **Devotion 2 Feeling the Joy of God's Presence**

Luke 15:1-10

Where do you find joy in your relationship with God? Is it listening to special music at worship? Is it sharing in communion? Is it at the birth of child? Is it in finding something you have lost for a long time?

The two parables in these verses are about finding something that is lost. At the time of Jesus, a hundred sheep were a sign of prosperity. These sheep were often kept for eight to nine years for their wool. The shepherd would always walk ahead of the sheep to scout out danger. The shepherd cared about all the sheep. If one were lost, it was important to find it.

We have all probably had valuable coins. When I was a boy, I remember my uncle gave me an 1887 silver dollar. In the years that followed, he gave me newer silver dollars. My collection grew to more than a dozen coins. I used to look at these coins and wonder how many places they had been. Who had touched them? One day I noticed a coin was missing. I searched until I found it.



I experienced the joy of finding that which was lost.

A key word in each of the stories is "lost". Have you ever felt lost in your relationship with God? I remember traveling alone in Europe while in college. There were many new faces and places, but none of these did I associate with the God I grew up with. I felt lost. It was comforting to find those places where I could connect with God – a friend here, a church there. It was because I was lost that I appreciated the love and security of God all the more. So too God feels this joy when we are found again.

Let us pray: Gracious Lord, there are times when each of us feels lost – living in a dark place, separated from your Word and loving care. We ask you to keep searching for us. Do not lose patience. We ask that your voice speak louder than the sounds of distraction around us. Do not lose perseverance. We ask that your Spirit touch our heart and mind. Remind us that you are our God and we are your people. May we share in your joy when we are found, and may we share the joy of your presence with others as a witness to you, our Lord. Amen.


#### Go Quickly and Tell

We have a picture of the women going to the grave that first Easter morning to anoint the body of Jesus. It is barely light, and perhaps they are speaking in soft voices. Certainly there is an air of solemnity, of sadness, for their Master is dead. Their hopes are gone.

Then we see them before the open tomb, bewildered, then fearful, as they see an angel with "appearance like lightning and . . . clothes . . . white as snow." The angel's first words are "Do not be afraid, for I know that you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. He is not here; he has risen, just as he said."

Perhaps some of us, too, have been bewildered, afraid. Even though we have always known the whole story – even though we look back on the Resurrection – we have been bewildered and afraid. Bewildered by circumstances in our lives. Afraid of the future. The angel says to us, too, "Do not be afraid . . . [Jesus] is risen, just as he said!" That truth makes all the difference, for, as Paul says, "Christ has indeed been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep" (1 Corinthians 15:20). Christ, the firstfruits, and then we with him!

Hardly taking a breath, the angel gives a command to the women: *Come and see the place where he lay. Then go quickly and tell his disciples: 'He has risen from the dead . . .'"* (Matthew 28:2-7). By faith, we, too, have seen the empty tomb; by faith in the Word of God, we know Christ is risen. The command is for us as well: **go quickly and tell.**


