

A Message from Bishop Bryan Penman

Dear Beloved in Christ,

September is always a season of change. The air turns crisp, school doors open, routines shift, and the long days of summer give way to the colors of autumn. The world around us reminds us that change is constant, sometimes gentle, sometimes disruptive, but always present.

Change can be hard. Our church knows this well. We are living in a time when we are being called into new ways of being the body of Christ, experimenting with

alternative leadership models, exploring life beyond buildings and budgets, and learning again how to be church with and for our neighbors.

Change can feel uncertain and even frightening. And yet, when we keep our eyes fixed on Jesus, we discover again and again that God equips us to do more than we ever thought possible.

The seasons themselves are a teacher in this. Autumn reminds us that letting go is part of life. The trees shed their leaves in a glorious display of color, and winter will soon follow. Death and loss are real. And yet, hidden in the soil is the promise of spring. Resurrection always has the final word.

We are also living through a season of change in our wider church. Soon we will give thanks for the leadership of Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton and Secretary Sue Rothmeyer, and we will welcome Presiding Bishop Curry and Secretary Mills. These faithful leaders will bring new energy and direction to our shared mission as the ELCA. With every goodbye and every hello, the Spirit is at work, refining us, shaping us, and calling us forward in hope.

What if we began to see change not only as loss, but also as invitation? What if letting go is really about laying aside the grave clothes that hold us back, so that we can rise in Christ to something new, something bold, something Spirit-led? Change may always carry grief, but it also carries possibility, the possibility that God is drawing us closer to the kingdom, to each other, and to the fullness of life we are promised in Christ.



This September, may we embrace change with courage, with trust, and with joy. For the God who has changed us through the waters of baptism continues to make all things new.

Council Highlights September 2025


COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS FROM COUNCIL MEETING ON 9-9-25



Pastor Mukesh led worship at Redeemer in Jamison on August 31st. We welcomed retired Pastor Bill McGowan to Redeemer Penndel for the day. He provided a sermon focusing on our beautiful sanctuary and stained glass windows, which was "eye-opening" to all. Gail will share the document that she has on the stained glass windows with the congregation. Pastor and Gail will be meeting soon to plan for our fall worship services, and then the Worship and Music Committee will be meeting.


SOCIAL MINISTRY TEAM – Collection of cleaning supplies for the residents of the Penndel Shelter and our food pantry was suspended during August and will resume for a one-time collection on Sunday, September 21st. Donated items and items that have already been purchased with a Thrivent Action Team card will be assembled by Patti and Cindy for distribution. The Social Ministry Committee met on August 31st to plan the Mission Festival Auction scheduled for September 28th. Proceeds of the auction will be split between Doctors Without Borders and social ministry funding for our local homeless neighbors who frequent the Reach Out organization in Penndel. Thanksgiving and Christmas initiatives were discussed. The committee also began planning the distribution of Christmas gift bags at the December 2nd shared meal. Approximately 50-60 gift bags will be filled with body, hand, and foot warmers. The school supplies that were donated by the congregation will be picked up by Mena Green, BCHA social worker. The school supplies will be distributed to the children at the Penndel and Morrisville emergency shelters. Mena has requested to meet with us to discuss ways that we can help the residents at the shelters.



Social Ministry Report September 2025

9/10 - Delivered school supplies to the BCHA Penndel facility. Mena Green was overjoyed by the quality and quantity of the supplies, which included backpacks and lunch boxes, paper, art supplies, etc.



9/15 - Had a very productive meeting with Mena Green (BCHA, Social worker/case manager) to discuss ways that Redeemer can assist her clients. Mena is profoundly grateful for the help that Redeemer consistently provides throughout the year and especially during the holidays. Several funding sources have been or will be cut back by government budgets so what we can do to help will make a big difference.

Needed Turnover Items - residents usually turn over on a yearly basis. No new turnovers are expected for the next 6-7 months. Items needed are plates, bowls,



cups, pots/pans, towels, wash cloths, and bath mats. One current client is expecting a baby next month and will need bottles, baby blankets, and onesies.

Recurring Needs - Laundry detergent, cleaning supplies, baby wipes. I let Mena know that we are collecting cleaning items for the residents this Sunday, and I will try to get them to her by the end of the month. Diapers are not needed because the clients can get them from the local diaper bank.

Mena mentioned that their food pantry at Penndel periodically runs low on supplies. I informed Mena that our food pantry is open Mon-Fri, 12-1 pm. I also let Mena know that we provide a free shared meal to the community on the first Tuesday of the month. Neither of these resources were previously known at the shelter. In the summer of 2026 I will remind Mena of the VBS program at Redeemer, which would allow a little free time for the mothers as well as a meal for their child.

9/15 - Contacted Kathy Rehm to express my deep sympathies. Additional meals were offered, as well as any other type of support that Social Ministry may provide.

9/21 - Collection of cleaning supplies for the emergency shelter residents and our food pantry



9/28 - Held the Annual Mission Festival Auction. A total of \$671.00 was raised, and the proceeds will be split evenly between Doctors Without Borders and social ministry funds to assist our homeless neighbors. A check for \$335.50 has been written to DWB from the Social Ministry account.

An anonymous donor has generously offered to match all donations, tripling the impact of your gift for a total contribution impact of \$1,006.50!

I want to commend the committee for all the extra help this year due to my shoulder injury. Special thanks to Edna Schwenk, Karen Kondryk, Marilyn Hwrynk, Deb Farnham, and our most talented Auctioneer, Cindy Oser




















Blessing of the Animals Saturday, October 4, 2025 10:00 am



Recommended Food Items for Winter

Focus on shelf-stable, easy-to-prepare items that provide high calories to help people stay warm:

Protein: Canned tuna, chicken, salmon, canned or dried beans (like chickpeas, black beans, kidney beans), and peanut butter.

Grains: Whole grains, rice, oatmeal, and whole-grain crackers.

Hearty Meals: Soups, stews, and chili are excellent as they are easy to heat and eat. Instant and powdered soups are easy to make and easy to carry.

Fruits & Vegetables: Canned fruits in juice (not syrup) and low-sodium canned vegetables.

High-Calorie Snacks: Nuts, trail mix, and protein bars provide sustained energy.

Cooking Staples: Cooking oil, spices, and pasta sauces are versatile additions.

Drinks: Coffee, tea, powdered milk and cocoa can be used for warming drinks.

Important Donation Tips

Check Dates: Never donate expired or near-expired food.

Avoid Perishables: Most food pantries cannot accept perishable items like fresh produce or dairy that require refrigeration.

Look for Pop-Top Cans: These are helpful for people who may not have can openers.

Contact the Pantry: Always check with your local food pantry or food bank to learn their most needed items, as needs can vary.

Climbing Higher

In a unique way, the author Max Lucado offers an interesting perspective regarding the life of Christians and the branches of a tree. According to his tree analogy, most Christians sit comfortably on low-lying thick branches. Life for Christians next to the trunk of the tree is steady and predictable. There are higher branches, but they appear risky and a lot less comfortable. In our humanity, we desire to stay where it is safe and easy. We become branch-sitters.

Again considering the analogy of the tree, we can say that Jesus calls each of us to climb higher in our prayer life, in our worship, in reading his Word, and in our generosity. As we climb, the branches will be thinner and less steady, but Christ will support us. The world tells us to stay put on our secure big branches, but the one who loves us is quietly nudging us to go higher. Jesus wants us to depend on and trust in him. He promises that he will never leave us.

One climb that we may resist the most is in the area of giving. The average Christian household gives approximately 2.7 percent of their income to their church, so most of us are sitting securely on some rather low branches. Our heavenly Father wants us to climb higher in the area of our giving. "On the first day of every week, each one of you should set aside a sum of money in keeping with his income, saving it up, so that when I come no collections will have to be made" (1 Corinthians 16:2). We are to climb so that we regularly give a portion of our income. As we climb in our giving, we show our gratitude and thanksgiving for all of God's blessings. When we climb toward the branch that

says "tithe" and go beyond that branch to the one marked "sacrificial giving," we hear God's Words, "Well done, good and faithful servants" (Matthew 25:21).

Our prayer is that Christians will take God at his Word, his promise to take care of us and provide for our needs and follow the Holy Spirit as he leads us to higher and higher branches. After all, God knows better than anyone the cost of hanging on a tree.
